HalSail FAQ

What features have been added to HalSail recently?

HalSail is constantly updated to bring in more features and to keep it running smoothly. The latest innovations are:

- Full compliance with Racing Rules of Sailing 2021 2024 from World Sailing.
- Display all your latest results in a sequence on a big screen. All races on the last day of racing shown for 20 seconds each in a continuous sequence. If there are overall results for each series these are shown too. Once the sequence is finished the display reverts to the start and repeats ad infinitum.
- Set an embargo policy for each series so that the public cannot see results immediately after they have been entered. This can be set to no embargo (the default), 5 minutes after the last result was input, 1 hour after the last result was input, midnight on the day the last result was input, or embargoed for ever so that they are invisible to the public.
- Staggered starts for races where boats start at intervals. Note, this is not the same as pursuit races where boats start at times adjusted according to their handicaps.
- Series can be scored by helm, rather than by boat. Useful if people change boats during a series.
- Integration with SailEvent for online entry and app-based tallying afloat and ashore.
- High-points scoring as an option for overall series results. Unlike the normal low-points scoring, the boat with the most points wins. Points are allocated as follows:
 - One point for competing (coming to the starting area)
 - One point for finishing,
 - One point for each boat beaten.
- IRC ratings imported automatically from RORC and applied automatically as the default handicap in IRC racing classes.
- Upload results to the RYA's Portsmouth Yardstick online database all in one go. Previously this could only be done one race at a time.
- Integration with Irish Sailing Live database of results for Irish clubs.
